The participants were seen very excited by involving themselves in the workshop.




The Village Development Committee of the village has arranged a tea party both for the organising committee and the participants in the workshop. We also brought some sweets for the workshop.

- 2. To study the health conditions of women workers of the tea estate.

The women workers have been seen working in rain in the tea estate. Some women have been seemed to be very weak who are not eligible to work, but the authority of tea estate appoints them to work in such pathetic condition.

- 2. The respondents have understood the questions and answered each question properly.
- 3. They have asked about the health conditions and medical facilities available for them in the tea estate.
- 4. They have succeeded in suggesting advice to them to contact their personal matters with the ASHA workers during pregnancy period.

The team has completed the survey at 2:30 pm during the heavy rain and have the return journey by 2:40 pm. Report of Field Study

A Field Trip to The Assam Co-operative Jute Mill Ltd. Silghat, Dist: Nagaon, Assam Date: 28th December, 2021

A field trip or an excursion is a journey by a group of people to a place away from their normal environment. Field trip is an organizes visit of teachers and students to immediate or distant places to enrich learning experiences and to further instructional purposes of regular classroom activities. Life in the classroom can cover only a small part of our total life. If learning is to result in the total development of the learners, must go beyond our school/ college walls in to the community as students and as working participant.

As a part of study we, the department of Economics have decided to go to the Assam Co-operative Jute Mill Ltd. Situated at Silghat of Nagaon District on 28th of December 2021.

On that particular day the teachers of the Department, 22 nos. of students have the journey from the campus of Marangi Mahabidyalaya to Silghat at 7 A.M. The Assam Co-operative Jute Mill is situated approximately 104.9 K.M. from the college. We have reached the Mill at about 10 A.M.by a bus reserved by the Department. Along with the field study we have arranged a picnic on the bank of the River Brahmaputra which is flowing nearby the Mill. We have had our breakfast there and started our journey to the Mill as directed by the supervisor Mr. Gogoi and reached there by 11 AM.

The Co-operative Jute Mill was registered in the year 1959 under the Assam Co-operative Societies Act. and the Mill commenced its commercial production in 1970. The Mill is situated on the South bank of the river Brahmaputra located at about a distance of 8 km from Jhakhalabandha. The location of the Mill is very beautiful with hill and river. The place is a great archaeological and histprical value as it has Kamakhya Temple, Trishuldhari Temple, Samantagiri, Simolagarh and some heritage Bungalows of British era, Gandhi Asthidham etc.

Objectives of the Field Study:

The main purposes of our field trip to the jute mill are –

- 1. To study the production process, raw materials and technology used in the Mill.
- 2. To study the employment opportunities provided by the Mill to the local people.
- 3. To Study the working environment within the Mill.
- 4. To study the impact of the Mill on the environment.
- 5. To study the various services provided to the employee.

<u>Methodology:</u>

During the study at the Mill the primary data are collected and some secondary data also collected from the official documents of the Government of Assam. A simple questionnaire was prepared for students to collect the primary data.

The methods which are used in the study are Descriptive and Historical.

Benefits of the study:

This field trip has helped our students to gather knowledge about the history of the Jute Mill, its current position, production per year, its volume of export to other states of India, the technology used in the production process, total number of permanent employees and temporary workers engaged in the Mill.

The students are able to collect the data using the questionnaire and they have succeeded in fulfilling the objectives of the study. They have also known from the study that other various products like decorative items, beautiful bags, ropes, wall hangings etc. can be made from jute. These type products have great market demand and it helps them to earn money. Thus, the Mill provides employment opportunity to a large number of local people.

From this study the students are able to realize that it is not an easy task to work inside the the Mill with high volume of machinery sounds. The workers do their works in a very noisy environment which may deteriorate their health. So the students have realized the importance of dignity of labour by visiting the Mill.

They are also able to realize that the local people who are engaged there on contractual basis are expert in their works.

Besides, the students have got the opportunity to visit the various historical temples situated beside the Mill like Kamakhya Dewalaya, Trishuldhari temple etc. Such types of holy places help the people to develop spirituality and give heavenly peace to them.



Conclusion:

After completing the study, we have returned from Silghat at about 3P.M. with lots of knowledge, experiences and positive vibes. The journey has make the students joyful and thought it as a great job for them.
