3. To make aware the students for participating in extra-curricular activities.

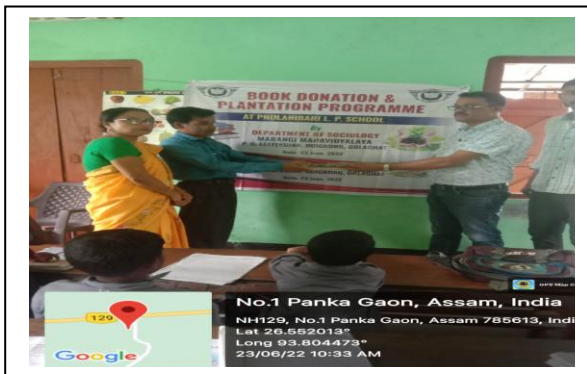
Explanation:

Findings

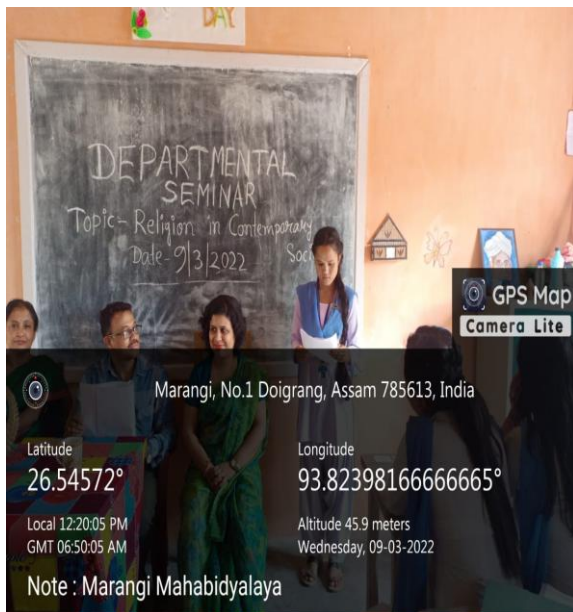
The students are able to learn much Knowledge both in techniques of research and ethnicity and society.

Introduction

Thus, one can acquire knowledge and solve problems by conducting field studies in different places. Viewing this, the department of Sociology, Marangi Mahabidyalaya (Degree) decided to conduct a field study with the students of the department at Aruna Bar Ali Village, Kakilamukh.

Objectives of the study

About the process of the Study

After a discussion between the students and the teachers of the department we decided to conduct a field study at Kakilamukh, Jorhat on 14th February, 2020. Most of the people of the village by occupation are cultivators and fishermen and so, we decided to study on their Socio-economic life. At first the teachers and the students approached the village headman and described the purpose of the visit in that village. The headman of the village then assured the students and the teachers to help in data collection from the village. The students then started house to house data collection with the help of the headman.

During data collection, the students (interviewer) identified the village as socio-economically significant. So, after completion of data collection, the students are asked to prepare a field report on the topic 'Socio-economic Life of the Mishing Community: A Study in Aruna Bor Ali Village of Kokilamukh.'



Findings

About the process of the Study

A discussion is done regarding the field study with the teachers of the department and decided to conduct a field study at Bohikhowa Gaon under Bokakhat Sub-division. In this purpose, permission is asked from the principal and he agreed with us and permitted for conducting the field work. So, we four teachers of the department set out our journey on 17th December, 2017 for field work at Bohikhowa Gaon, Dhanshrimukh, under Bokakhat Sub-division. The Bohikhowa Gaon is situated in the southern part of the river Brahmaputra. The distance of this village from Bokakhat town is about 7 km. There are 81 families living in this village with their own culture and tradition. Majority of the families of the village are Mishing. So, at first we attempted to identify the Mishing families for collecting house to house data. The students then started to collect data from the Mishing families. The village headman of the village guided the students for collecting data from the families of the village. On the basis of the data collection, the students of the department are asked to prepare a project report on the topic 'Socio-economic Status of the Mishing Community and its Changing Pattern: A Study in Bohikhowa Gaon'

Introduction

Field studies collect original or unconventional data via face to face interviews, surveys, or direct observation. This research technique is usually treated as an initial form of research because the data collected is specific only to the purpose for which it is gathered. On the basis of such technique of research, department of Sociology, Marangi Mahabidyalaya (Degree) has been taken a decision to conduct a field study at Kali Bari Chuk Village, Tezpur on 28th December, 2021.

Objectives of the study

1. For acquiring knowledge in conducting the techniques of field study
2. To know the techniques of community studies

About the process of the Study

In response to the order given by the Principal, Marangi Mahabidyalaya (Degree) dated 17th December, 2021 we decided to conduct a field study at 'Kali Bari Chuk Village', Tezpur. So, we the four teachers and 31 students of the department started our journey on 28th December, 2021 at 6:30 A.M to Kali Bari Chuk Village, Tezpur and reached there at 9:30 am. The students meet there the headmen of the village (Rajendra Das is the headman of the village) and started to collect different information/data from him about the village.

At first, the students attempted to identify the various castes/communities of the village and found it is a multi-cultrural village consisted of different communities. The students identified there the 'Mech Tribe' as the major tribe of the village. So, they started house to house visit and collected data from the respondents belonging to the Mech Community. They finished the process of data collection at 3pm and came back home at 4pm.



The Mech is an ethnic group belonging to the Bodo-Kachari group of peoples. It is one of the scheduled tribes found in different parts of Assam. Kali Bari Chuk village is one of the village of Assam situated in the eastern part of Tezpur town. The distance of the village from Golaghat is about 143 kilometers. This village has a heterogeneous character in case of population structure. Bodo (the Mech is belonging to this community), Deuri, Nepalis, Chutia and Koibortta are the significant community of the village. The Mech is the major community so, the students have decided to conduct the study on this community of the village. This village is a historical one; because some historical monuments are found in the village like ‘Dr Bhupen Hazarika Samadhithal’, Ban Raja Pahar, Bhairab Mandir etc.

The Mech community has its own customs, traditions, language and many other socio-cultural characters. But in the study the students found that most of them have lost their traditional character and have accepted some new ones like customs, tradition, religion, language etc. It indicates their socio-cultural changes in their life. So, this study aims to explore the *socio-economic changes of the Mech Community of Kali Bari Chuk village*.

1. This study helps the students to learn the techniques of data collection
2. This study helps the students to gather researchable knowledge

Conclusion:

The study in Kali Bari Chuk village is a necessary one which will help the student to gather new knowledge regarding the socio-cultural changes of the Mech Community.
